
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Building Broadband for the 100th MN State Baseball Tournament: A Community Collaboration

In anticipation of hosting the prestigious 100th Annual MN State Amateur Baseball Tournament, the Litchfield Baseball Association (LBA) embarked on a journey to enhance the tournament experience for players and fans alike. Recognizing the importance of reliable broadband access, LBA President Brian Jones spearheaded efforts to ensure seamless connectivity throughout the event.

Having broadband access at the MN Baseball Tournament is crucial for several reasons. First, it allows for efficient communication and coordination among teams, coaches, and officials. Instant access to scores, schedules, and realtime updates ensures smooth operations and enhances the overall experience for participants and spectators.

Additionally, broadband access enables live streaming of games, allowing friends, family, and fans who cannot attend in person to still enjoy and support the tournament remotely, promoting inclusivity and expanding the tournament's reach.

Months prior to the tournament, Jones initiated discussions with local internet providers to assess their ability to meet the State's requirements. In October 2022, he reached out to potential partners, seeking internet and Wi-Fi services for critical areas such as the press box, beer tent, and the trailer house on the north side of the 3rd base line. The LBA's aim was to create an immersive and technologically advanced experience for players, media, and attendees.

Following comprehensive evaluations and deliberations, VIBRANT Broadband emerged as the preferred choice for the

LBA. In February 2023, the Cooperative's Design Engineers visited Optimist Ballpark to evaluate the site and devise a tailored plan for the broadband infrastructure. Their expertise and commitment to meeting the State's requirements further solidified the partnership.

By May 2023, the LBA announced its collaboration with VIBRANT Broadband, assuring the community that reliable and efficient broadband services would be available throughout the tournament. With VIBRANT's support, LBA could offer high-speed internet access for streaming TVs in the beer tent, a dedicated 150mbps connection in the trailer house, and internet connectivity in the press box to cater to radio and TV broadcasters.

This concerted effort to build out broadband infrastructure exemplifies Meeker Cooperative's commitment to the community. The collaboration between the LBA, VIBRANT Broadband, and other local

CEO MESSAGE 2023 LEGISLATION IMPACTS

The 2023 legislative session, which began in January and concluded on May 22, was one of the most consequential in history for Minnesota's 1.7 million cooperative members. Record investments, key policy changes, and the landmark 100% carbon-free by 2040 mandate all made this legislative session one with big, long-term impacts on everyone using electricity in the state.

At the forefront of advocating for our Cooperative memberowners, the Minnesota Rural Electric Association (MREA) actively engaged with lawmakers to ensure our voice was heard. They worked tirelessly to shape the outcomes of the session, and I would like to share with you a summary of the key developments that will affect all of us.

100% CARBON-FREE BY 2040

The first and most impactful bill for electric cooperatives and their member-owners was the historic 100% Carbon-Free by 2040 bill, which was signed into law in early February. The legislation, passed in record time, is widely regarded as the most significant energy policy ever passed in Minnesota and mandates that all electricity sold in the state comes from carbon-free sources by the year 2040.

Naturally, as a cooperative that provides electricity to our members, we are concerned. Whenever something is mandated, the price tends to go up and the affordability of electricity for our members is always a prioirity at Meeker Cooperative. 31-08-202 Additionally this law also presents significant challenges regarding reliability.

As a result, MREA worked with lawmakers to add some common-sense amendments to help protect affordability and reliability. However a lot of investment, innovation, and ingenuity will be necessary to avoid cost increases and potential service disruptions. Significant advancements in technology will also be needed to achieve the mandate.

The good news here is that Minnesota's electric cooperatives are leaders in navigating the clean energy transition, and while we understand that change can be concerning, we're confident that we'll be able to meet this mandate with the help of our wholesale energy providers.

STATE COMPETITIVENESS FUND

As you have just read, investments in Minnesota's electric grid have become more critical than ever. With the recent federal funding from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), it is

imperative for Minnesota to aim high and attract significant federal dollars. Consequently, lawmakers have allocated \$190 million to establish the State Competitiveness Fund which will be utilized to attract hundreds of millions of dollars for investments in Minnesota's energy infrastructure.

The funds will be utilized by cooperatives throughout the state, with an additional \$5.3 million specifically allocated to consumer-owned utilities. These funds will support projects aimed at improving affordability, enhancing reliability, and facilitating the energy transition.

ELECTRIFICATION REBATES AND GRANTS

The State of Minnesota wants to help you electrify your life and has introduced a rebate program that provides up to \$2,500 for new electric vehicles priced below \$55,000, and up to \$600 for used vehicles under \$25,000. This rebate opportunity is available to individuals, businesses, nonprofits, and government entities. However, those who have already received an EV rebate or tax credit from Minnesota are not eligible for this particular program.

Furthermore, individuals interested in acquiring highly efficient heat pumps for their homes can benefit from rebates of up to \$4,000. The state legislature has also allocated grant funding for various initiatives such as solar installations on schools, electric bikes, electric school buses, pre-weatherization efforts, and more.

As I conclude this column, I want to remind you of Meeker Cooperative's unwavering commitment to your best interests. We are fully dedicated to finding ways to provide reliable and affordable electricity to our members. While the path forward may be complicated, our determination remains steadfast.

Thank you for your continued support and trust in us as we navigate the impacts of the 2023 legislative session. Together we will embrace the opportunities and overcome the challenges that lie ahead.





ENERGY EFFICIENT PEAK SHAVE WATER HEATING PROGRAM



Discover how the Peak Shave Water Heating (PSWH) program from Meeker Cooperative can revolutionize your hot water system, providing uninterrupted comfort while significantly reducing your energy costs. Find out how you can enjoy plenty of hot water and incredible savings today!

The PSWH program allows Meeker Cooperative to temporarily interrupt electricity to your water heater only during periods when the demand or cost of energy is high, while still providing hot water for your normal daily needs. You're rewarded with a low energy management rate. An interruption, called a control period, may happen several times a month for up to 8-hours per occurrence. There are more than 3,300 members participating on the PSWH program who are enjoying plenty of hot water AND saving money.

With electric water heating you'll have the safest and most reliable water heating system you can chose for your home or farm. 25-31-425 There are no worries about open flames or lack of adequate venting that are common with gas water heaters.

You will be saving money on the PSWH program.

The water heater is metered separately at the energy management rate of 6.2¢/kWh in June, July, and August (equivalent to \$1.08 propane) and 5.7¢/kWh in the other months (equivalent to \$1.00 propane).

• Meeker Co-op provides the metering and load control equipment. Member is responsible to have an electrician install the equipment.

7 COMMON CAUSES OF **POWER OUTAGES**

Meeker Cooperative has a strong reliability record. However, there are many reasons why even the best utilities experience outages.

1. SEVERE WEATHER

Severe weather conditions like lightning, heavy rains, high wind speeds, or tornadoes can damage power lines, causing blackouts.

2. MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS

Accidents involving utility poles can disrupt power supply in affected areas.

3. EQUIPMENT FAILURE

Electrical equipment can fail due to age or mechanical issues, leading to outages.

4. TREES AND VEGETATION

Falling branches during storms can cause short circuits, interrupting power.

5. HIGH ENERGY DEMAND

Extreme weather conditions can overload the grid, resulting in temporary outages.

6. PUBLIC DAMAGE Unsafe digging, equipment or line damage, or theft.

7. PLANNED OUTAGES

Scheduled outages for maintenance, repairs or system upgrades ensure reliability and safety.

FEATURED RECIPE Grilled Margherita Pizza

Congratulations to Shelley Carter for submitting this issue's winning recipe.



INGREDIENTS:

- 1 store-bought pizza dough
- Olive oil, for brushing and drizzling
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 pound fresh mozzarella, sliced 1/4-inch thick
- 3 Roma tomatoes, sliced 1/4-inch thick
- Handful fresh basil leaves

DIRECTIONS:

Stretch and shape the dough into a 12-inch round on a flat surface. Brush the top with oil, salt and pepper and toss on the hot grill, oil-side down. Cook until the bottom is golden brown, 1 minute. Flip it over and repeat. Remove to a sheet pan. Cover the grill so it retains the heat for the next step. Drizzle the top with more olive oil. Put the mozzarella and tomato slices on top and season with salt and pepper. Return the pizza to the grill on the sheet pan, cover the grill and cook for 3 or 4 minutes to melt the cheese. Remove from the grill and tear the basil leaves over the top. Slice and serve immediately.

USDA AWARDS RECONNECT BROADBAND FUNDING TO VIBRANT BROADBAND

Meeker Cooperative Light & Power Association has been awarded a grant of \$19,039,348 as part of the ReConnect broadband funding program by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). This investment aims to expand highspeed internet access in rural areas. The grant will be utilized to deploy a fiber-to-the-premises network passing about 700 homes, as well as businesses, farms, and an educational facility.

Meeker Cooperative aims to make high-speed internet affordable by participating in the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) Affordable Connectivity Program. This funding aligns with President Biden's agenda to rebuild the economy by improving infrastructure and expanding access to reliable and affordable internet services for rural communities.
