A&C FARM SERVICE: GROWING WITH THE TIMES

A&C Farm Service has been a trusted name in agriculture since 1963, when Jerry Kern and Alvin Winter first opened their doors. Originally selling Allis-Chalmers, New Holland, and Gehl equipment, the business steadily grew alongside the farming community it served. In 1977, Jerry purchased Alvin's share of the business, and he and his wife Eileen continued to lead the operation. Following Jerry's passing in 1996, A&C became a family-run business, led by Eileen Kern and her children Larry, Lori, Randy, Ron, and Kevin.

Today, A&C Farm Service offers a wide range of products, from major ag equipment brands like Chandler, DR

Equipment, Gehl, Generac, Grasshopper, Kinze, Kioti, McCormick, Meyers, New Holland, Simplicity, Vermeer, Versatile, Westfield, and Wilrich, to outdoor power equipment including Ferris, Dr. Grasshopper, Toro, Husqvarna, Land Pride, Snapper, Yamaha ATVs, and MokWheel electric bikes. They've also expanded with an Auto Value parts store to meet growing needs.

Over the decades, the agricultural landscape has changed dramatically. "Farms have grown, and equipment has gotten a lot bigger and more complex," said Kevin Kern.

"Back in the '60s, planters were four or six rows. Now they're 12, 16, even 24 rows. Tractors that used to be 60 horsepower are now 700."

Reliable electricity and broadband have become just as critical to A&C's success as the equipment they sell. "Everything revolves around computers now," Kevin explained. "When the power goes out, our hands are tied. We can't look up parts, can't run diagnostics, it just shuts us down." Fast, dependable broadband through Vibrant Broadband is equally essential. "Every part of our business runs through the internet," Kevin said. "Ordering parts, updating tractor software, even dealing with manufacturers—most of them won't even take a phone call anymore. It's all online."

In addition to traditional equipment, A&C Farm Service is helping customers embrace the future with electric-powered options. Rechargeable yard tools like weed trimmers and handheld blowers are becoming increasingly popular, offering ease of use and low maintenance—especially appealing to older customers. "The biggest service issue we see with gas-powered tools is dirty carburetors from old gas," Kevin shared. "With electric, there's no gas, no carburetor issues—just plug it in and go. It's especially helpful for older folks who have a hard time starting gas engines."

A&C also carries electric bikes from MokWheel, offering affordable and practical options for both recreation and short-distance transportation. "Our bikes are a great way to save on vehicle wear and tear, and some even come with solar panels to recharge," Kevin added. "Plus, it's a nice way to unwind after a day's work and get a little exercise."

Members will soon have a chance to see some of A&C Farm Service's latest offerings firsthand. At Meeker Cooperative's upcoming Annual Meeting and Member Appreciation Event, A&C will be showcasing their lineup of electric-powered yard tools and MokWheel electric bikes. Every May, Electrical Safety Month serves as a vital reminder of the importance of preventing electrical hazards at home. Electricity powers nearly every aspect of modern life, but if handled improperly, it can pose serious risks, including injuries and property damage.

Meeker Cooperative understands the risks associated with improper electricity use, which is why we're committed to reminding you to stay vigilant and practice electrical safety not only in May, but year-round.

By following key safety practices, you can reduce the risk of electrical hazards and ensure your family stays protected. Here are five essential tips for powering up safely at home.

- **1. BE VIGILANT.** Regularly inspect your home's electrical system for any signs of damage or outdated components and replace any frayed electrical wires or cords. 25-22-407 The Electrical Safety Foundation International estimates roughly 3,300 home fires originate from extension cords every year, either from overloading, overheating or fraying. If you're relying on extension cords as permanent power solutions, consider contacting a qualified electrician to install additional outlets where you need them.
- 2. USE SURGE PROTECTORS. Safeguard your sensitive electronics and appliances from surges with surge protectors. These handy devices help divert excess voltage away from your electronics, reducing the risk of damage or electrical fires. Not all power strips include surge protection, so read the product label carefully. Additionally, surge protectors can lose effectiveness over time and should be replaced when damaged or outdated.

- **3. PRACTICE SAFE POWER STRIP USE.** Avoid overloading electrical outlets with power strips that exceed the outlet's capacity. High-energy devices, like heaters, microwaves and hairdryers should be distributed across multiple outlets. Overloading an outlet with a "busy" power strips can lead to overheating and create a fire hazard, so be sure to check the power strip's wattage rating before plugging in items.
- **4. WATER AND ELECTRICITY DON'T MIX.** It may seem obvious, but accidents involving water contact with electrical items happen. Always keep electrical appliances and devices away from water sources, like sinks, bathtubs or swimming pools. Make sure your hands are dry before touching any electrical switches or appliances—never handle electrical devices with wet hands. Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCIs) should be installed in areas where water and electricity are typically in close proximity, including kitchens, bathrooms and outdoor outlets.
- **5. EDUCATE FAMILY MEMBERS.** One of the best ways to ensure the safety of everyone in your household is to talk about electrical safety. Teach children not to play with electrical outlets or appliances and ensure they understand the potential dangers of electricity. Create and practice a home fire escape plan that includes electrical safety precautions in case of emergencies.

Practicing electrical safety at home is essential for protecting your family, property and peace of mind. Remember, electrical safety isn't just a one-time effort, it's a year-round responsibility.

KNOW WHAT'S BELOW. CALL BEFORE YOU DIG.

Most of us never think about the electric, gas, water, and other utility lines buried below the ground, but hitting one of these lines while digging is not the reminder you'll want—trust us! If you are planning a digging project, call 811 at least three business days before you start. Or you can submit a request online by visiting www.call811.com.

MOVE OVER TO KEEP OUR CREWS SAFE


When our employees need to stop alongside a roadway, they create a work zone using flashing lights and traffic cones. These signs signal to passing drivers that workers are present and vulnerable. 25-32-139 One of the best ways you can help protect them is by following Minnesota's Ted Foss Move Over Law.

This law requires drivers on roads with two or more lanes to move over one full lane away from any stopped emergency or maintenance vehicle with flashing lights, including utility vehicles. If moving over isn't possible, you must slow down and pass carefully.

While most people know this law applies to police, fire, and ambulance vehicles, it also includes utility, maintenance, and construction crews. Our team is out there working to keep your power on please do your part to keep them safe.

FEATURED RECIPE

HASSELBACK KIELBASA | SUBMITTEED BY: SHELLEY CARTER BLOOMINGTON



INGREDIENTS

- ¾ pound yellow onions (2 to 3 onions)
- 1 (1-pound) fennel bulb, stalks removed
- 1 each red, yellow, and orange Holland bell pepper
- Good olive oil
- 2 tablespoons minced garlic (6 cloves)
- 2 teaspoons minced fresh thyme leaves, plus extra sprigs
- 1 teaspoon whole fennel seeds, chopped
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 pounds fully cooked, smoked kielbasa
- ¼ cup Dijon mustard
- ½ cup liquid honey

DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 425°F. Slice the onions into ½-inch thick half-rounds and place in a large bowl. Cut the fennel into 1-inch wedges, keeping the core intact, and add to the bowl. Slice the peppers into 1-inch strips, removing stems and seeds, and add them too. Toss the vegetables with 4 tablespoons olive oil, garlic, thyme, fennel seeds, 2 teaspoons salt, and 1 teaspoon pepper.

Spread the vegetables in a single layer on a large roasting pan or two sheet pans. Roast for 20 minutes, stirring once. While roasting, slice the kielbasa into ¼-inch pieces, but leave the bottom intact. After 20 minutes, stir the vegetables again and remove the thyme.

Place the kielbasa on top of the vegetables. Mix the mustard and honey, and brush it over the kielbasa. Roast for another 30 minutes, brushing with more honey mustard every 10 minutes. When the kielbasa is browned and crispy, sprinkle the vegetables with a little more salt and serve hot with the extra honey mustard.


MEEKER COOPERATIVE'S ANNUAL MEETING AND MEMBER APPRECIATION EVENT!
